

Workshop On Numismatics and Epigraphy: Methods and Techniques

Background

To enhance the capacity of the researchers, the Asiatic Society of Bangladesh (ASB) has decided to organize a daylong workshop on Numismatics and Epigraphy: Methods and Techniques.
